Claudia has a B.A. in Elementary and Special Education from Trinity College and taught intellectually-disabled children for seven years in the public schools before becoming a missionary.

Together they worked for the General Board of Global Ministries (GBGM) for 12 years and then started *Joy in the Harvest* in 1992.

The Wertzes have been married since 1972 and have two married children, Kimberly and Luke (both born in Africa), and five grandchildren.

The Challenge of Today's Africa

Tanzania is twice the size of California with over 25% of the land designated as wildlife reserves, holding all of Africa's "big five" animals. Located in Tanzania are Mount Kilimanjaro, Africa's tallest mountain at 19,341 feet, and the historic tropical island of Zanzibar, "the gateway to Africa."

Tanzania has a population of 64 million with 125 tribes and 120 different languages, but only two official languages: English and Swahili. 49% of the population lives on less than \$1.90 per day. 65% live in rural areas, and 60% lack electricity and clean water. About 35% of Tanzanians are Muslims. Life expectancy is 66 years. 50% of Tanzanians are age 17 or younger.

Kigoma is located on the western side of Tanzania on the shore of Lake Tanganyika, the second deepest lake in the world. Kigoma town's population is

about 160,000. The Kigoma region, with a population of about 1.5 million, is the second poorest area in Tanzania. Known for its witchcraft, it is located close to three major war zones of the last decade. It is a place of great need both physically and spiritually.

Areas of training we provide include theological education, computer technologies, radio broadcasting, construction and business management. Hard work with accomplishments brings self-respect and dignity. Africans want to work and learn.

Technical Ministries

Technology can be used as tools for discipleship. Technology can greatly expand the effectiveness of a limited number of Christian workers. Computer science is changing Africa forever. Our FM radio station, *Radio JOY*, is reaching hundreds of thousands in a large geographical area with the Gospel and the highest-quality programs. Over one-third of our listening audience is Muslim. As the only local radio station in the area, we have a large, interested and involved audience. We are excited about the new opportunities the Lord is opening with technology.
