Dear Friends and Churches,

We are celebrating the fifth anniversary of *Joy in the Harvest*. Five years of incredible ministry and spiritual blessing to thousands. Some of the highlights from 1997 –

- *Jesus* Movie evangelism presented the gospel to thousands of Africans. <u>Many decisions</u> were made for Christ.
- Refugee ministries continued. Distribution of Bibles, food, clothing, educational supplies, medicines, and toys blessed many. Our truck transported Zairian refugees from the beaches of Kigoma to camps. It also transported supplies, and clothes for refugee children.
- Construction of the **new mission station** began. Two containers of construction supplies arrived safely with the supplies to build the first three buildings. The missionary residence is up and under roof. After our return, approximately three months will be needed to finish it's construction. The remaining land was bulldozed and is ready for construction.
- Our airplane, 5H-JOY, flew in support of the work of *Joy in the Harvest* and the refugee ministries. <u>We</u> installed a **new engine in the airplane**.
- Our <u>furlough</u> and visitation of churches occupied the second half of 1997. It has been a blessing to be back with the people and churches that are making *Joy in the Harvest* a reality.
- Joy in the Harvest sponsored two Women's Retreats. They have prepared and donated gifts for the destitute elderly in South Africa and health kits for Tanzania.
- Other highlights: participated in missionary Bible studies, financial support for the destitute in South Africa through Aid to the Aged, continued approval by the Evangelical Council for Financial Accountability, assistance to indigenous Christian ministries in Tanzania, received a new computer to begin a training program, helped support the Kigoma Destitute camp, served on the Board of Directors of the Baptist Hospital of Kigoma, had a booth at Purdue '97 Congress of UM Men, and Lowell & Claudia celebrated their 25<sup>th</sup> wedding anniversary
- Finances for 1997 are ending in the black. Building program will need about \$40,000 more to complete the mission station.

We praise God for His love. Merry Christmas!


### What's the Latest News From Africa?

## Q. What is the current political situation in your area?

A. We continue to follow press reports and info from friends.

Tanzania — remains stable and the Burundi and Zaire refugee camps continue to operate. Refugees from Rwanda have all gone back. Defensive military buildup in the Kigoma area continues due to the military threat from Burundi.

Congo (Zaire) — the new strongman government killed up to 20 renegade soldiers in the capital. 20 to 42 lashes given to

110 journalists for meeting with the opposition. UN investigation of alleged killing of thousands of Rwanda refugees stalled by government. Outbreak of Congo pox disease reported in the north. **Burundi** — fighting continues on the border with Tanzania. 100 rebels killed in the southern province. Tutsi minority (14%) control the government and Hutu majority (85%).

Rwanda — Hutu rebels killed 290 while trying to free imprisoned comrades. Estimated 15,000 rebels are based in the north. Tutsi government denies massacring up to 8,000 Hutus civilians.
