Alexander Graham Bell, the inventor of the telephone, once stood next to a piano. Without touching the piano, he sang a steady low note. The piano strings started to vibrate and made a sound of their own. They were resonating to his voice.

I Thessalonians 2:4 speaks of being "entrusted with the Gospel".

It is at conversion that our trust relationship with the Gospel starts. When the Gospel arrives, we are drawn to Christ. Something within us knows -- we are being called to someone High and Wonderful. Few respond to the Gospel because they are smart enough to do so. When the Gospel arrives in all of its glory and power and gentleness and forgiveness, something deep within us just knows. We were made for this. We, frail creatures, are entrusted with its great treasures in our hearts. We believe, love, and value this fantastic Gospel. As long as one Christian's heart is beating, the Gospel has a home.

Being entrusted with the Gospel means it must go beyond our own hearts. As its truth resonates in us, we know others need it too. If the spiritually lost need the Gospel, we must take it to them. Jesus is the theme of the Bible. The Gospel is His story. He tells us to go into all the world and preach the Gospel. He trusts we will. It would seem He has more faith in us than we have in Him. We fail more than we succeed; we are faithless more often than faithful. Yet He still entrusts us with the Gospel. Let' be trustworthy.

What's New With The Radio Station?

Q. What is the current situation with the Radio Station project? (asked many times)

Radio JOY is still in the planning stage, but we have seen some real progress. Concerning the License, our friend, John Everett, made a trip to Dar es Salaam to provide more information to the government about our application. The report is that all went well and it seems

that the last step before being granted a license is an interview with me upon my return to Tanzania. Concerning the equipment, all, yes ALL, the needed equipment and supplies have been acquired and have been shipped in the ocean container. We praise God for this huge accomplishment of research, shopping, and shipping. We will have high quality

equipment that will give our station reliability. Pray for its safe arrival. **Concerning Volunteers,** God is providing us with qualified people to help at each step. Many of the best and brightest want to see God's word on the airwaves in Tanzania. We need their help! **Concerning Funding,** we walk by faith, not by sight. We need about \$25,000 to get this new station on the air and in the black.
