
Security helped keep crowds of desperately sick people in order.

Free Medical Clinic for the Poor!

Jesus went through all the towns and villages, teaching in their synagogues, preaching the good news of the kingdom, and healing every disease and sickness.

An incredible medical team of 14 arrived from flood ravaged Houston TX and 3 from Kenya to bring medical help and a Christian witness to the poor of the Kigoma region.

It took more than a year of planning. This team from Kingwood UMC, did

not let their flood stop them, although some of their homes were damaged, they came with soaring spirits to serve their Lord. Horrible diseases and wounds, like many of the doctors had never seen before, were treated with compassion and modern medicines. Thousands of dollars of donated and purchased drugs were used and given without cost to people who could never afford them.

Over 1,800 patients were treated. Over 500 of those needed multiple appointments with our doctors.

The team worked long hours sometimes not eating dinner until after 8PM. It was a max effort.

It was our biggest and most effective medical outreach ever. Thank you for your prayers. \mathcal{H}

Lowell Travels to Ghana for 'Africa By Radio' Conference

Every two years there is a Continental Convention for all Christian broadcasters in Africa committed to reaching every person with the Gospel.

Lowell flew to Ghana to attend the convention and while there was asked by **Berni Dymet**, whose program is heard daily by millions on 1,000+ radio stations in 160+ countries, if *Radio JOY* could partner with him to bring his programs to the whole Swahili speaking world. We accepted and are now working on translations to make it happen. *Radio JOY* is currently broadcasting his programs in English.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Is the Feeding Center Open?

Q. Were you able to get the feeding center open again? Are the kids eating?

— asked by many

A. Yes, **Praising God** that we are back feeding the kids.

The closing of the feeding center came as a real shock to us. We could not imagine such a thing coming from the government here. At the same time they ordered all the children not to beg in public any more. This left the

kids with no alternative to get food. We held numerous meetings with the government. Our pastors and administrators did excellent work in the negotiations. It was finally requested of us to write a letter giving our position. We sent a strong letter. Our negotiating team felt we should risk reopening the feeding center even without an official lifting of the ban. For the sake of the children, we did so. There has been no action taken against us. One of the people causing us problems was fired. The poor kids and adults are eating again, three times a week.
