

My preaching stopped. The pandemic is worse than anyone could have imagined. But our joy, found in Christ, is more real than virus or life's circumstances. Christ came that first Christmas so He could redeem us and we could be His joy forever.

JOY Holds Advanced Training for Ministers

Two advanced study programs were taught at *JOY*. Thirty Bishops and Pastors (including three from JOY's staff) were taught at the Degree Level. Another twenty were taught at the Diploma Level. The teaching staff were visiting Professors from a Christian Bible College in Tanzania. All students who passed their studies are scheduled to graduate on December 18, 2020.
