

How is Lowell's Knee? — Part 2

How is Lowell's knee?

— asked by dozens (thanks so much!)

One year ago I fell in the dark and badly hurt my left knee. Months of pain in Africa, was followed by an unsuccessful meniscus surgery in South Africa in March 2024. In July 2024 I had total knee replacement in the USA. The first four weeks were very painful. After six weeks of

physical therapy, my range of motion was okay. Working through the pain, we started speaking in August. People have been so kind — helping in every way. I have the most prayed over knee in America. I am improving but the doctor just said it will take at least six more months to heal. I am taking less pain medicine and stopped using a crutch. However, furlough camping is interesting. Praising God for His healing.
